Brown Act:

The legislative body of a local agency may use teleconferencing in connection with any meeting or proceeding authorized by law. Cal. Gov't Code §54953(b)(1). A "teleconference" is "a meeting of a legislative body, the members of which are in different locations, connected by electronic means, through either audio or video, or both." Cal. Gov't Code § 54953(b)(4). A local agency may provide the public with additional teleconference locations. Cal. Gov't Code § 54953(b)(4).

The teleconferenced meeting must meet the following requirements:

(1) it must comply with all of the Act's requirements applicable to other meetings;

(2) all votes must be taken by roll call;

(3) agendas must be posted at all teleconference locations and the meeting must be conducted in a manner that protects the statutory and constitutional rights of the parties or public appearing before the body;

(4) each teleconference location must be identified in the notice and agenda and each location must be accessible to the public;(5) during the teleconferenced meeting, at least a quorum of the members of the legislative body must participate from locations within the boundaries of the body's jurisdiction; and

(6) the agenda must provide the public with an opportunity to address the legislative body at each teleconference location. Cal. Gov't Co).

I recently listened to a podcast (Stay Tuned with Preet) in which Daniel Kahneman was interviewed. He may already be a familiar name to some of you. He wrote the book, Thinking Fast and Slow, is known for his work on the psychology of judgement and decision making, and behavioral economics, for which he won the Nobel Prize in Economics.

I found the discussion about his most recent book: Noise: A Flaw In Human Judgment to be fascinating, and also relevant to our discussions. Kahneman talks about the randomness that influences all kinds of decisions from sentencing decisions by judges to decisions about who to hire.
